# Hemoglobin A1c

A1c is the best test that measures your average blood sugar over the past 3 months. For most people an A1c of 7 and under is the goal but this can vary based on age and health conditions. Make sure to discuss your A1c goal with your doctor. Higher A1c levels are associated with diabetes complications like stroke, and diseases of the heart, kidney, and eye. It is recommended to test your A1c twice a year if you are meeting your A1c goal and more often if you are not.

## Kidney Health

Monitoring for the presence and progression of kidney disease is a part of diabetes management. If appropriate, a urine test called urine albumin creatinine ratio (uACR) and a blood test called estimated glomerular filtration rate (eGFR) are performed at least annually to monitor your kidneys.

### Eye Health

Having diabetes puts you at risk of diabetic retinopathy that can cause vision loss or even blindness. It is encouraged that you have an annual diabetic dilated-eye exam to monitor for signs of damage or disease.
